"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law." -Galatians 5:22-23.

Do you feel freedom in following God's purpose for you or do you feel confined by a list of rules? What opportunities of the flesh win out over your desire to love others?

And above all things have fervent love for one another, for "love will cover a multitude of sins." -I Peter 4:8

Look up the definition for "fervent." Would a fervent love be passive? How does love cover our sins?

"But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin." -I John 1:7

What does it mean to walk in the light? What will happen if we walk in the light as Jesus does? Describe what fellowship means to you.

How will you walk in the light today? Will it be with freedom? Or do you feel too cautious and afraid to make a mistake? Let us show love without fear of offending or doing wrong.
